The Jews in Bulgaria wore the same ones. He worked as a cobbler for the partisans. He did this illegal work in a basement workshop in Bitola. My brother Sami was a very small, gentle, good person. I loved him a lot. Shlomo I did not like so much, but Sami I loved a lot. I named my son, Sami, after him. I could have named my son Avram, but instead I gave him my brother's name.
