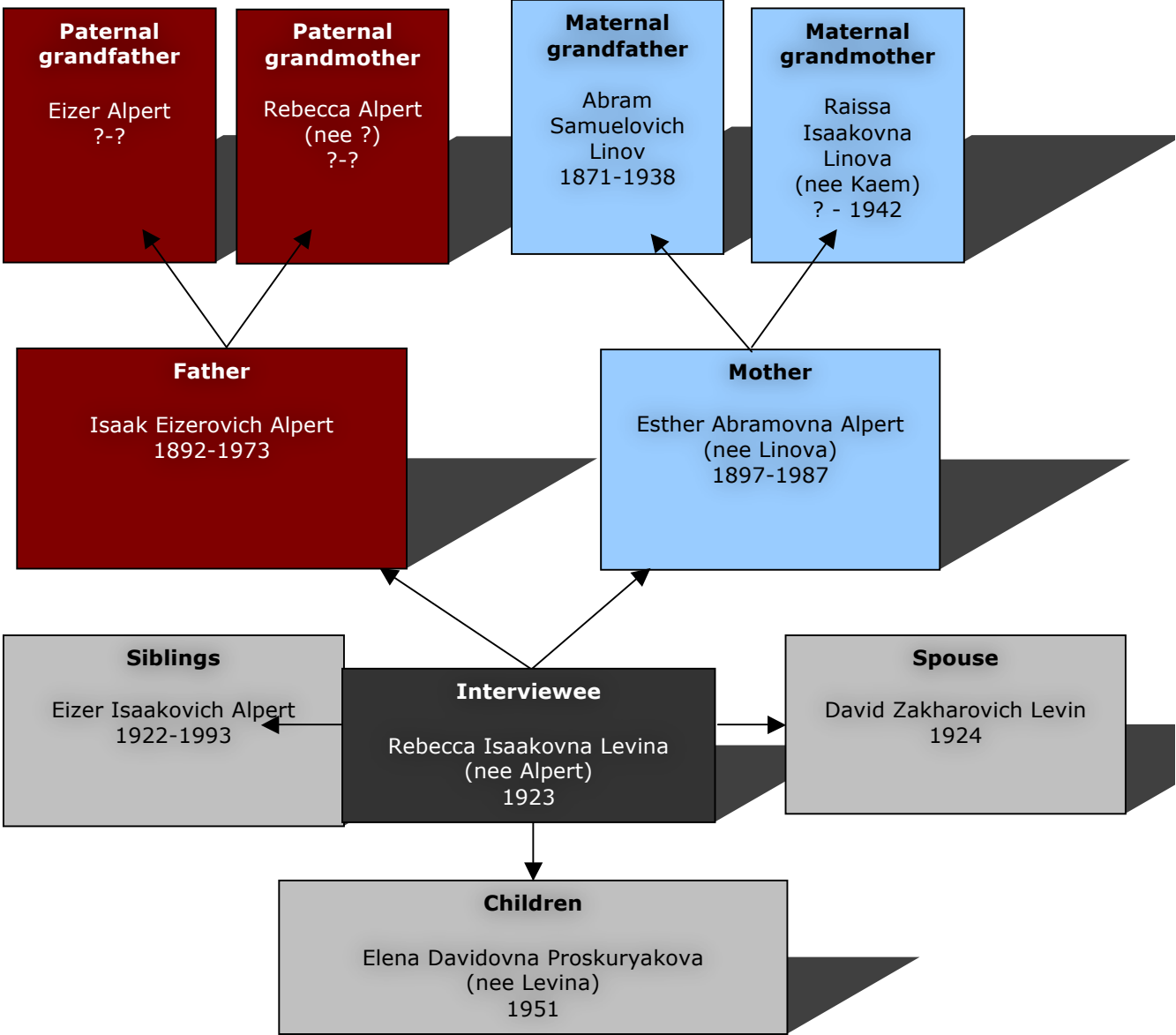

Head teacher, head of Russian language department at Daugavpils Pedagogical Institute; teacher (department of Russian language for foreigners, Leningrad Pedagogical Institute); teacher of Russian language at Leningrad Gorny Institute

*What was the level of religiosity in your parent's home? How were you raised?*

My parents were religious; they prayed and observed some of the Jewish traditions, for example Father prayed and read the Torah. We children were raised in the secular atmosphere, because we were influenced more by Soviet and Communist ideas. We didn't learn Yiddish, didn't celebrate Jewish holidays. We never went to the synagogue, because in Bologoye there was no synagogue.

In Bologoye, then in evacuation in Saratov, and on the front in aviation troops, she finished the war in Königsberg

She was a housewife, lived in Moscow
