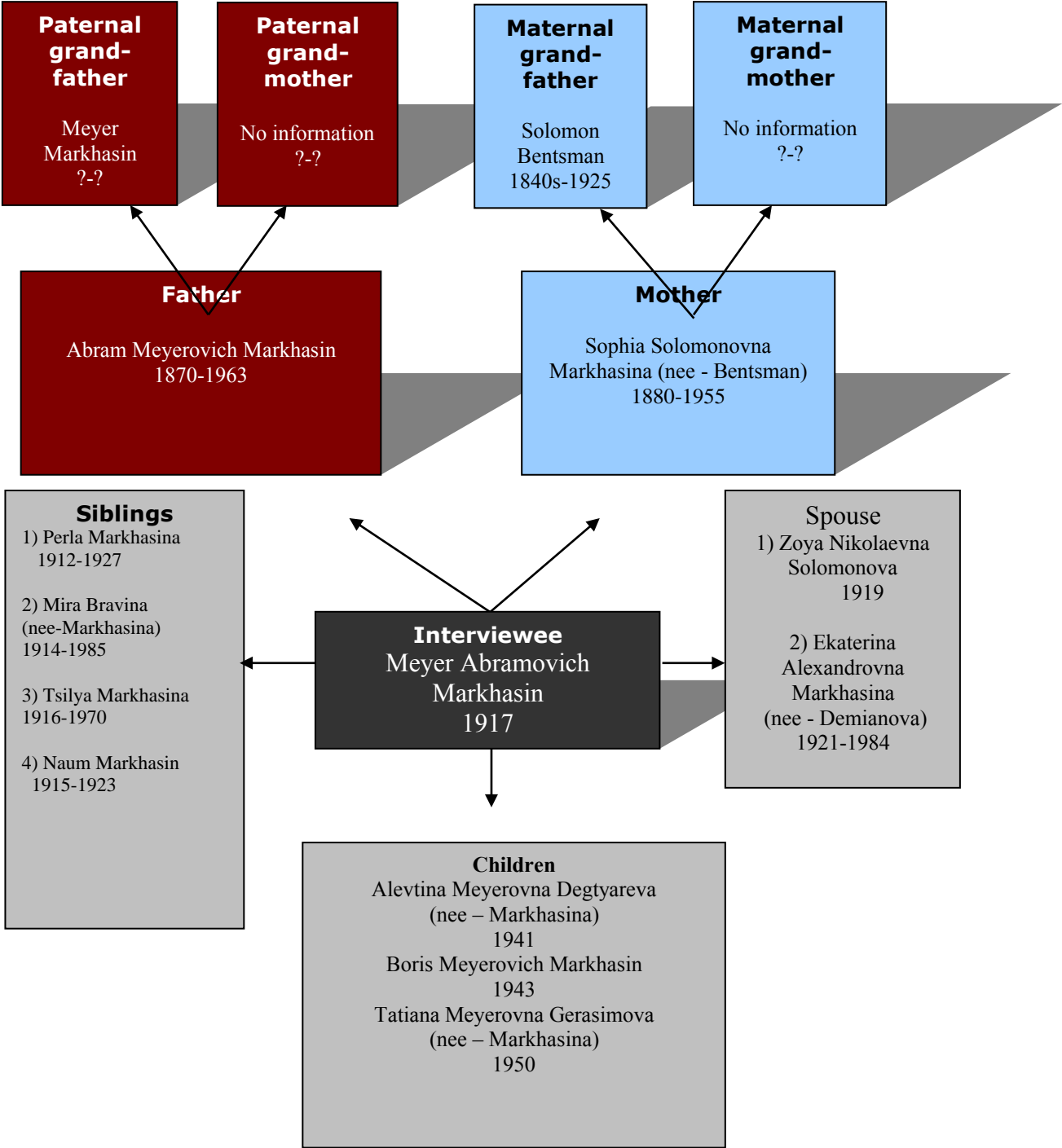

1937-1941: Institute of Technology named Molotov, Leningrad

1943-1944: Moscow Institute of Technology of Light Industry named after Kaganovich

What sort of work do/did you do?

1944-1946: Kalinin factory of light industry, shift mechanic

1946-1947: "The Russian Diesel" factory, department the chief mechanic, engineer, Leningrad

1948-1951: Kalinin factory of light industry "Kreps", deputy head of the mechanical factory

1952-1958: Leningrad Chemical Plant of Light Industry, chief mechanical engineer

1958-1974: Leningrad fur factory №1, main chief mechanic

1974-1977: chief mechanical engineer of four fur factories of Leningrad and Leningrad region

1977 - till now: retired

1) Daughter Eleonora, 1943, engineer at Kulakov factory, Leningrad, from 1993 - in Israel

2) Daughter Tatiana, 1945, engineer, Kirov factory, Leningrad

Tsilya: no children of her own, she adopted a girl from an orphanage Svetlana, who now resides in Israel
